Precautions

Please read the following important instructions before getting started.

1. The iBPC Series isn't equipped with any storage devices (HDD/SSD/SD card etcs). Purchase a storage device that meets power consumption, temperature, and vibration requirements.

2. The iBPC Series isn't equipped with an operating system. An operating system must be installed on a storage device first before installing any software into the BoxPC.

2. Disconnect the power cord from the BoxPC before making any installation. Be sure both the system and the external devices are turned OFF. Sudden surge of power could ruin sensitive components. Make sure the BoxPC is properly grounded.

3. Make sure the power source matches the power rating of the BoxPC.

4. Turn OFF the system power before cleaning. Use a damp cloth instead of liquid or spray detergents for cleaning.

5. Do not leave this equipment in an uncontrolled environment where the storage temperature is below -40 $^{\circ}$ C or above 75 $^{\circ}$ C. It may damage the equipment.

6. Never open the equipment. For maintenance reasons or mounting the components, only a trained technician is allowed to do so. Most integrated circuits are sensitive to static electrical charge. To avoid damaging chips from electrostatic discharge, observe the following precautions:

- Before handling a board or integrated circuit, touch an unpainted portion of the system unit chassis for a few seconds. This will help to discharge any static electricity on your body.
- When handling boards and components, wear a wrist-grounding strap, available from most electronic component stores.

1. Introduction



iBPC series is a fanless embedded box PC, wide operating temperature and wide range voltage capability, allow it run in the harsh environments.

iBPC series comes with the same interfaces: four RS-232/422/485 ports, VGA, HMDI, Audio, dual Gigabit Ethernet LAN ports and four high-speed USB 2.0. And there are various CPU options: iBPC-4081 is with one Intel® ATOM Quad Core 1.91Ghz Processor E3845 (with 4GB on-board memory).

Two SMA type connector opening for antenna, optional I/O expansion board (XV-board), provides high protection I/O, $+10 \sim 30$ VDC power input connector, and one power switch. One 2.5" SATA HDD drive bay is also set up in the embedded computer to possess sufficient storage.





1.3. Overview

The iBPC Series modules are equipped with several interfaces and peripherals that can be integrated with external systems. Here is an overview of the components and its descriptions.

The details of these items are as follows:

SMA Connector

The BoxPC has 2 SMA connectors that are usually used for GPS and WiFi antenna systems.

Rotary Switch

Rotary Switch is an operating mode selector that provides functions to configure with the selection of operating mode and authorization control.

Power Switch

The power switch enables or disables power to electric circuits and loads in the BoxPC.

Microphone-in and Earphone-out

The microphone-in and an earphone-out can be used to process the input and the output of sound.

Power Input

The Box has a 3-wire terminal block; there has 2-wire for the power input and a wire for the frame ground.

Connector for optional XV-board

The XV-board slot can be used to communicate with one XV-board. The XV-board can be used to implement various I/O functions such as DI, DO, A/D, D/A, Timer/Counter. CF Card Socket

The BoxPC comes with a CF card inside the CF socket. The CF card can be used to restore the BoxPC system or expand the memory up to 32 GB. (Shipped without any CF card)


Hard Drive Tray




2.1. Mounting the BoxPC

The BoxPC can be mounted either directly to a wall/panel, or onto a stainless 35mm DIN rail.




DIN Rail mounting




A stainless steel DIN rail is recommended.



2.2. Deploying a Basic BOX-PC System


The BOXPC provides a variety of communication interface to suit a range of application. Here is a simple application for using the BoxPC.

- Step 1: Connect the positive terminal (+) of the power supply to the terminal <u>PWR1/2</u> and the negative terminal (-) of the power supply to the <u>P.GND</u>
- Step 2: Connect the USB mouse or the USB keyboard to the USB port
- Step 3: Connect the monitor to the VGA port
- Step 4: Connect to PC or the laptop to the LAN port via an Ethernet switch



2.3. Mounting a HDD


BoxPC has a HDD tray that supports 2.5-inch disk drives and 2.5-inch flash drives.



Step 1: Remove the 2drive screws to take out the HDD tray


2.4. Mountinga XV-board







2.5. Inserting a Mini PCIe

iBPC series supports 1 Mini PCIe slot.




Step 1: Remove cover screws to remove the cover

Step 4: Close the cover and then fasten the screws




2.6. Adding an External Antenna

The BoxPC has two antenna connectors for the WIFI module of mini PCIe. Since the housing is locked. It is difficult for the user to mount the cable to the antenna by himself/herself so the preset has already been installed in the housing. On the installed cable, one side is the antenna and the other side is the connection hole for the cable to be placed.

The BoxPC has two cables which mount on the PCB of the BoxPC like below.



After you insert a WIFI module of mini PCIe (you can refer to the chapter 2.5 Inserting a Mini PCIe), you need attach the cable on the mini PCIe module like below, and mount wireless antenna, then you can use the WIFI module at BoxPC.



3. BIOS Setup

BoxPC is equipped with the AMI BIOS stored in Flash ROM. These BIOS has a built-in Setup program that allows users to modify the basic system configuration easily. This type of information is stored in CMOS RAM so that it is retained during power-off periods. When system is turned on, BoxPC communicates with peripheral devices and checks its hardware resources against the configuration information stored in the CMOS memory. If any error is detected, or the CMOS parameters need to be initially defined, the diagnostic program will prompt the user to enter the SETUP program. Some errors are significant enough to abort the start up.

Entering Setup -- Launch System Setup

Power on the computer and the system will start POST (Power On Self Test) process. When the message below appears on the screen, press **> Del** key will enter BIOS setup screen.

Press to enter SETUP

If the message disappears before responding and still wish to enter Setup, please restart the system by turning it OFF and On. It can be also restarted by pressing <Ctrl>, <Alt>, and <Delete> keys on keyboard simultaneously.

Press <F1> to Run General Help or Resume

The BIOS setup program provides a General Help screen. The menu can be called up from any menu by pressing <F1>. The Help screen lists all the possible keys to use and the selections for the highlighted item. Press <Esc> to exit the Help screen.

How to recovery the BIOS setting


If it isn't necessary, recommended that you should avoid changing the chipset's defaults. Changing the settings may cause some problems. If there is a situation where you cannot reboot, you want to recovery the BIOS setting to the original settings.

Recovery the BIOS settings, you need close the power of BoxPC and uninstall the battery from BoxPC, then want about 10~15 seconds and install the battery. After that, you will get an original BIOS setting.

About uninstalling/installing the battery, you can refer to the chapter Appendix D.


4. Driver & Software installation



C. How to change the battery

The BoxPC device is equipped with a Li-ion battery to ensure that any data stored in the BIOS setting is retained if a power loss occurs. The batteries supply continuous power to the store chip enabling the data to be retained for up to 7 years. The BoxPC will lose data, when the battery is removed, if you don't want losing data, you need remember the setting which you changed, and recover the setting after you replace the battery. And please care when you replace the battery, it is dangerous at power up of the BoxPC.



The following figures show the location of the battery installed on the BoxPC device.

Checking the current battery power level:

- 1. Run the PAC Utility and check the battery in the System Information. These fields indicate the current status of battery. If the power level of the battery is shown as low, battery should be replaced.
- 2. When creating a custom application, call the pac_GetBatteryLevel() API function in the PACSDK.dll to check the power level of the batteries. If the power of the battery shown as low, it is recommended that battery is immediately replaced.

• Replacing the batteries

- Power off the BoxPC device.
- Remove the cover.
- Remove the battery with Screw Driver.
- Insert a new battery.
- Power on the BoxPC device.






